

“Know Your Constitutional Rights” Cards To Use For Cellphone Photos



Use your cellphone to snap pictures of the English version and your own language’s version of the “Know Your Constitutional Rights” cards. Take one picture of the left side of this card and one picture of the right side of this card. This will allow you to always have this Constitutional Rights card readily available if you encounter an ICE or CBP agent and what to declare your constitution right to remain silent, not give them permission to enter your home or non-public work site unless they have a judicial warrant signed by a judge or magistrate, not sign anything....

Only show the rights card’s photo images to an ICE or CBP agent through a window, **BUT NEVER GIVE THEM YOUR “UNLOCKED” PHONE.**

You can tell an ICE agent that you do not want them to have your cellphone, or

- Directly state your refusal: “I am not comfortable providing you with my phone.” or
- Ask for justification: “Do you have a warrant to access my phone?” or
- Exercise your right to remain silent: “I would like to consult with an attorney before providing you with any information from my phone.”

1. For Cellphone Picture – Know Your Constitutional Rights Card – English Version

You have constitutional rights:

- DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR if an immigration agent is knocking on the door.
- DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS from an immigration agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING without first speaking to a lawyer. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your home, ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say yes, leave calmly.
- GIVE THIS CARD TO THE AGENT. If you are inside of your home, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.
